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Challenge 3 Analysis: Fostering Community Involvement in Emergency Preparedness

Solution 1: Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT)

Solution Elements

Solution 4 Community Emergency Planning Committees

Form Community Emergency Planning Committees that include community leaders, residents, and local authorities to collaboratively develop, implement, and maintain disaster preparedness plans tailored to the specific needs and risks of their communities.

Solution Elements
